Spirea originates from the Greek word, speira, or “wreath” in reference to the orientation of the shrub’s delicate flowers.





Did you know?

Spirea make great companion plants when grouped with other shrubs, perennials, and small trees.



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Did you know?

Spirea are not considered toxic to dogs or cats. All parts of the plant are edible.

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Did you know?

“False spirea” is an entirely different plant. *Sorbaria sorbifolia* is a hardy deciduous shrub that has clusters of small, white blooms in June and July.

Spirea is native to Japan, China, and Korea.

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Did you know?

Spirea flowers are great for cutting and are well suited for indoor bouquets.

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Did you know?

Spirea are great candidates for erosion control along hillsides, forming a beautiful flowering mass groundcover.

Spirea are extremely easy to dig up and transplant if needed.

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
